While COVID-19 continued to challenge our community, 2022 marked the beginning of a return to normalcy for our residents and businesses. In the Spring, we were thrilled to bring back in-person networking events for our member businesses like our monthly Coffee & Commerce. As the weather started to warm, our communities gathered at our weekly farmers markets - Tuesday afternoons at the Low Line Market under the Southport Station and Sunday mornings at the Roscoe Village Farmers Market. We celebrated the fresh air and summer vibes with an amazing calendar of events for our residents. including Burger Fest, Taco Fest, and our beloved Porchfest in both Lakeview and Roscoe Village. For the first time SSA 27 also brought two Craft Markets to Lincoln Avenue in May and October, offering a new place to linger over handmade works of art while listening to live music. From Ice Sculpting and Lakeview Roscoe Village Restaurant week to start off the year through to the beloved

holiday tree & menorah lightings that closed out 2022, the past year has been full of creating meaningful connections with our area businesses & neighbors while celebrating the best of Lakeview and Roscoe Village.

One of the biggest undertakings of 2022 will be completed in the Spring of 2023: the Lakeview Roscoe Village Master Plan. Inspired by the roadmap of the 2011 Lakeview Area Master Plan (LAMP), this project is being led by our outside consultants MKSK and their partners at Firebelly and Big Buzz Idea Group. Following months of community outreach, research and evaluation, the Lakeview Roscoe Village Master Plan will provide an implementable, community-oriented plan intended to guide projects and development over the next 7-10 years, and will be debuted in the second quarter of 2023.

Within the pages of this annual report, I encourage you to explore the four program areas that make up our work: Neighborhood Promotion, Business Development, Advocacy, and Public Space Enhancements.

The Lakeview Roscoe Village **Chamber of Commerce** is



#### Innovation



With the addition of Roscoe St to our annual Beer Stroll, we achieved



our goal of connecting our two neighborhoods between three different route options. Attendees strolled down Lincoln Ave and Roscoe St as our businesses turned into complete tasting destinations. We had a total of 30 businesses open their doors to shoppers and with the help of Bitter Pops and Beermiscuous, we were able to place breweries within the participating locations. We had an all-time high in terms of ticket sales for this event, which resulted in over 400 total tickets sold compared to just over 200 last year.





We have been part of the LRVCC Beer Stroll since 2018, it has now become a tradition with my staff and colleagues and we look forward to it every year! # **Our Program Areas**

### Business Development

e provide regular networking and education events as well as one-on-one technical assistance in order to strengthen our businesses, while also recruiting new businesses to our community.

# In-Person Networking Opportunities are Back!

Since the easing of the COVID-19 pandemic in early 2022, we are back to in-person networking events including Coffee & Commerce, Northside Networking, After Business Networking Nights, and our Multi-Chamber Networking opportunities. In 2022 we hosted 23 networking events with over 600 attendees. Additionally, we supported 8 events with our partners. Our networking events have brought together businesses to

make connections, grow their networks, and help make referrals across our neighborhoods. We also worked with our fellow Chambers of Commerces across the city to connect businesses across neighborhoods and assisted with gaining new clients as well as connections. We look forward to expanding our After Business Networking Night program and continuing finding creative ways to connect our businesses.

### **Advocacy**

e serve as the voice of local businesses and protect our neighborhood's commercial interests by representing small business needs on important policy and development issues that impact our area.

In 2022, LRVCC and the entire city of Chicago was challenged by

ongoing safety issues and an uptick in crime. The Chamber worked closely with our partners at the Chicago Police Department, Cook County State's Attorney Office, and our Aldermanic offices to keep businesses informed about safety

issues and help prevent crime. We attended monthly meetings with all three partners to bring up concerns we hear from our businesses and safety issues. We also hosted three safety seminars with our various partners. Finally, we promoted ongoing safety rebates that the entire city is eligible to receive as well as our SSA27 safety rebates.

In 2022, LRVCC also received two grants from the Chicago Department of Business Affairs and Consumer Protections as part of wider COVID-19 relief funds that the City of Chicago received. The first grant was the Storefront Activation Grant, which we received close to \$36,000, to activate a number of storefronts on Belmont Ave. in Roscoe Village and promote small businesses in the neighborhood. With this funding we were able to support 4 local artists to create 6 unique art installations on 2 commercial building which are currently vacant. This helps beautify the neighborhood and was able to garner local as well as national news coverage. The second grant we received was a \$24,000 Non-Profit Capacity

Building Grant, which will be used in 2023. This grant is aimed to supporting local nonprofits prepare to bid on city contracts and grant opportunities. With this funding we are able to support staff time used in the logistics and communication of this project.

### **Public Space Enhancements**

e work to maintain clean, green, and welcoming sidewalks, and we develop new spaces that invite people to linger and connect with their community.

#### Community Mosaic

In 2022, SSA 27 brought a community-driven mosaic to Southport Corridor. The primary goal of this initiative was to engage the community in all aspects of the mosaic, and from conception to execution, local residents and businesses were engaged for input, ideas and feedback. Beginning with a community workshop to formulate a mosaic theme celebrating Chicago's seasons, and ending with hundreds of local resident and community organizations tiling

and grouting the mosaic with their own hands, this was truly a community-led initiative.

#### By the Numbers

West Lakeview was reinvigorated by **15** new pieces of public art, **11** of which are located along the Lakeview Low-Line. • SSA 27 awarded Community Events & Placemaking Grants to organizations offering events focused on film, youth programming, the arts, and more. • 1 new public space dubbed "Paulina Point" was brought to the community, offering seasonal plantings and seating for up to **20**.


